TVF awards a grant of £2,000 to continue its support for medical students studying at the University of Nottingham



'The Victoria Foundation is a hugely valued supporter of the University of Nottingham's international medical elective programme. As a crucial aspect of their training, the final year of our medical degree encourages our students to complete a practical placement in a healthcare setting to acquire hands-on experience in a professional environment.

Many students would like to undertake their elective abroad. The benefits of an elective are even more substantial when undertaken overseas as they allow students to be exposed to an even greater range of new learning experiences. However, most students are required to source their own funding for their placement, and so their numbers are limited by the high cost of international travel and accommodation.

The Foundation's support is helping everyone gain fair access to benefit from this unique learning experience in hospitals and other healthcare environments across the world. So far, students supported by The Victoria Foundation have undertaken placements in locations such as Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Vietnam, and India, gaining unique insights into how medical conditions, diagnoses and treatments can differ vastly across the globe.

"I am so grateful that TVF were able to fund the 'bike' that attaches to my wheelchair. It's an amazing mobility aid for me as I'm able to take the dogs out and use it to get around locally.

My old bike took its last breath last year, which caused me so many problems as I was unable to take my dogs out. Also, my bike gave me freedom and the feeling that I can walk, even though I'm in a wheelchair. I've always wanted to remain independent and active, and love wheelchair dancing and tennis. This bike enhances my life, brings me joy, and enables me to continue being independent.
